

**LIST OF ACHIEVEMENTS FOR GRADUATES OF BACHELOR'S DEGREE PROGRAMMES OR  
STUDENTS WHO HAVE COMPLETED THEIR THIRD YEAR OF A MASTER'S DEGREE  
PROGRAMME**

in the period covering the calendar years 2022-2026

Deemed as the highest standard of scientific achievement shall be the inclusion in the candidate's scientific record, within the discipline in which they are applying, of either at least two of the following achievements, or one of the following with a score of minimum 70 points:

- 1) authorship or co-authorship of a scientific monograph or a chapter in a scientific monograph – in accordance with the list of publishers issued by the Minister in charge of higher education and science, valid as at the date of adoption of the Resolution of the Senate of the Jan Kochanowski University of Kielce regarding the rules of admission of candidates to the Doctoral School at the Jan Kochanowski University of Kielce for the academic year 2026/2027;
- 2) authorship or co-authorship of a scientific paper published in a scientific journal or in peer-reviewed materials of international conferences – in accordance with the list of journals referred to in Article 267(3) of the Act on the Law on higher education and science (Journal of Laws of 2024, item 1571, as amended), valid as at the date of adoption of the Resolution of the Senate of the Jan Kochanowski University of Kielce regarding the rules of admission of candidates to the Doctoral School at the Jan Kochanowski University of Kielce for the academic year 2026/2027;
- 3) leadership of or participation in a research project funded under a nationwide or international competition;
- 4) a practical application of the results of scientific research or development work, including a granted patent or implementation of the outcomes of scientific activities in another form;
- 5) a scholarship awarded by a foreign institution;
- 6) a work of art or a project-based work of significant importance.

For the achievements referred to in Points 1 and 2, "co-authorship" shall mean the candidate's contribution to the publication of at least 25%.

The aforementioned scientific achievements must be documented in writing, in the form of:

- 1) photocopies of the pages from a scientific monograph or scientific journal, containing the author's first name and surname or the authors' first names and surnames, the title of the scientific monograph or scientific paper, the publisher's name, the place of publication, the month and year of publication, and either of the following numbers: ISBN, eISBN, ISSN, eISSN, ISMN or DOI;
- 2) statements by the co-authors of a scientific monograph or a chapter in a scientific monograph regarding the candidate's percentage contribution to the monograph or

chapter, or, for scientific papers, a statement by the corresponding author;

- 3) confirmation of the granting of a patent or the implementation of the outcomes of scientific, artistic or project-based work in another form;
- 4) a statement by the research project manager containing information on the project's number, source of funding, duration and objective, the role played by the person claiming the achievement within the project and the scope of their tasks, as well as the project's outcomes;
- 5) confirmation of receipt of a scientific, artistic or design scholarship awarded by a foreign institution;
- 6) documentation of artistic or project-based achievements.
